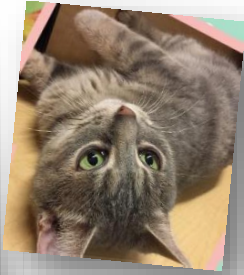


Founded in 1999, APA is an all-volunteer, no-kill rescue for homeless cats and kittens. *What does that really mean? How is APA different from other shelters in the area?*



- As a 501c3 tax-exempt organization, all expenses are paid with monies raised through our thrift store, Purr-fect Treasures, donations and fundraising events.
- Since we are a no-kill shelter, no healthy animals are ever euthanized. We see that sick and injured cats get vetted no matter what the problem so it isn't a sad environment to volunteer.
- No animal is made available for adoption until it has been spayed/neutered, micro-chipped, tested for disease and up-to-date on vaccinations. We feel strongly that spaying and neutering is the only long-term solution to pet overpopulation. According to Spay USA, an unsplayed female cat, her mate and her offspring, producing 2 litters per year, with 2.8 surviving kittens per year can total 11,606,077 in 9 years.
- APA has no paid staff. Our biggest asset is **our highly committed, unpaid volunteers**. Whether you have a few hours to spare or want to make a larger time commitment, we would love to have you as a volunteer. Volunteers, usually in teams of 2 or 3, come into the shelter **twice daily** to clean, do laundry, scoop litter, feed and water, administer medications, and most importantly pet and love our kitties.

We also need volunteers on Fridays and Saturdays during adoption hours to talk with visitors and assist them in finding their perfect kitty. This requires knowledge of the cats' personalities and the ability to read people and recommend the right fit for them and their home.

## Adoption Center at PetSmart

The Clarksville PetSmart is our adoption outreach location. We have enjoyed a great relationship with PetSmart for the past four years.

We cover four adoption hours a day at PetSmart with the exception of major holidays. Adoption hours are Sunday – Wednesday: 1 – 5 p.m. and Thursday and Friday: 4 – 8 p.m. This requires at least one volunteer and sometimes two depending on the week day. The shift can be broken into two-hour segments to accommodate busy schedules.

Similar to the shelter, the volunteer cleans the cages and feeds and waters the cats there. We generally have 5-6 adult cats there during the winter months but can feature up to 12 kittens during kitten season. Volunteers are trained in adoption procedures and it helps to have a good knowledge of the shelter.

Volunteer duties at the thrift store include customer service, cashier responsibilities, product merchandising, sorting and processing donated goods and general cleaning. The thrift store is open Wednesday – Saturday: 11 a.m. – 5 p.m. The store is also open during Downtown Jeffersonville events, like the Trolley Hops, Wine Walk, Cookie Stroll, Christmas Open House, etc.
